PREBID MEETING: A Prebid meeting for all bidders will be held at the Hancock County Courthouse located at 150 - 152 Main St., Bay Saint Louis, MS 39520 at on Friday 06/29/2018 at 2 p.m. local time. Prospective prime bidders are requested to attend. Bidders questions will be received up to 2 business days prior to meeting.

TIME OF COMPLETION AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES: Successful bidder shall begin work on receipt of Notice to Proceed and shall complete the Work within the Contract Time. Work is subject to liquidated damages.

BIDDER'S QUALIFICATIONS: Bidders must be properly licensed under laws governing their respective trades and be able to obtain insurance and bonds required for the Work. A Performance Bond, separate Labor and Material Bond and Insurance in a form acceptable to Owner will be required of the successful Bidder. Project to be coordinated in compliance with requirements for a historic landmark per Mississippi Department of Archives and History. Qualification of Contractor or Sub-contractors will be required for Historic elements of work per requirements of MDAH. Those qualifications shall be included with the bid package.
