1.0 INTRODUCTION

The Pascagoula-Gautier School District through the Office of Federal Programs is soliciting written proposals from potential professional development providers for district-wide training in the area of sheltered English instruction for teaching English learners. Sheltered English instruction delivers language-rich, grade-level content area instruction in English in a manner that is comprehensible to the learners. This includes physical activities, visual aids and the environment to teach vocabulary for concept development in mathematics, science, social studies and other subjects.

The proposal must address how the professional development provider will meet all the requirements listed in the **Specifications 4.0** and its sub-categories **4.1**, **4.2**, and **4.3** of **RFP 515-19**.

2.0 PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Pascagoula-Gautier School District seeks professional development for kindergarten through twelfth grade teachers in the sheltered English instruction approach to teaching English learners. This professional development will focus on instructional strategies connected to lesson preparation, instruction and delivery, interaction, practice and application, and assessment.

3.0 SCOPE OF WORK

- 1. Assist teachers with lesson preparation
- 2. Assist teachers with building background knowledge
- 3. Assist teachers with developing comprehensible input
- 4. Assist teachers with instructional strategies and lesson delivery
- 5. Assist teachers with assessing linguistically diverse students.
- 6. Assist teachers with planning for interaction
- 7. Assist teachers with practice and application of content

4.0 SPECIFICATIONS

4.1 Focus of Professional Development

- Assist teachers with designing lesson plans to meet the students' academic and linguistic needs.
- Assist teachers with building background knowledge in diverse learners.
- Assist teachers with developing comprehensible input
- Assist teachers with instructional strategies and lesson delivery in a language diverse classroom.
- Assist teachers with developing formal and informal assessment
- Assist teachers with planning student interaction to promote use of academic language.
- Assist teachers with developing opportunities for practice and application of academic content

4.2 Expected Outcome

- Discuss key points about factors that affect second language acquisition.
- Identify the components and features of the use of sheltered English instruction.
- Apply and practice the components.
- Incorporate sheltered instruction into lesson planning.
- Build a sample lesson using the sheltered instruction features and components.

4.3 Requirements

- Professional development is to take place over three consecutive days in the month of June 2019
- Each day will consist of approximately 6 hours of professional development
- The three consecutive days of 6 hours of professional development will equal 18 total hours
- Professional development provider will be able to train a maximum of 30 participants for the three consecutive days of 6 hours of professional development, 18 total hours
- Professional development provider will provide training materials necessary to implement sheltered instruction in the classroom.
