DIRECTIONS FOR USE

This multi-functional carpet cleaner is designed for Brush/Bonnet Cleaning, Extraction Cleaning and Pre-Treatment. ALL-IN-ONE™ is completely safe for stain resistant carpeting as well as other types of carpet. It can be used in hotels, motels, schools, offices, airports, hospitals, nursing homes, restaurants or any facility to maintain quality carpeting.

BRUSH / BONNET CARPET CLEANING METHOD

- 1) Pretest carpet for colorfastness in an inconspicuous area.
- 2) Remove furniture and dry vacuum thoroughly.
- In a pump-up or pressure sprayer, dilute ALL-IN-ONE™ at a rate of 1:90 (1.4 oz per gallon of water).
- Spray onto carpet in 6' x 12' sections at a rate of 500-600 sq. ft. per gallon of diluted product. DO NOT OVERWET THE CARPET.
- 5) BRUSH: Agitate the carpet with brush.
 - BONNET: Immerse bonnet in water, wring out thoroughly, then place bonnet on machine. Scrub carpet and change bonnet pad as it becomes soiled.
- After the carpet has been cleaned, the carpet should be brushed in one direction by a deck brush or carpet rake.
