GENERAL BID CONDITIONS:

ALL BIDS SUBMITTED SHALL BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH ALL CONDITIONS SET FORTH HEREIN. THE BID PROCEDURES FOLLOWED BY THIS OFFICE WILL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THESE CONDITIONS. THEREFORE, ALL BIDDERS ARE URGED TO READ AND UNDERSTAND THESE CONDITIONS PRIOR TO SUBMITTING A BID.

1. PREPARATION OF BIDS

1.1 Bids and/or Quotes may be submitted through the State of Mississippi's e-procurement system (MAGIC) or in person to the Mississippi Forestry Commission. Paper bids are allowed. All prices and notations must be printed in ink or typewritten. No erasures permitted. Errors may be crossed out and corrections printed in ink or typewritten adjacent and must be initialed, in ink, by the person signing bid.

1.2 To submit bids electronically, bidders must ensure they are registered in the MAGIC system and have received a login, password, and supplier number and that all technical requirements have been met.

1.3 If a bidder is unwilling or unable to participate through MAGIC, a Mississippi Forestry Commission representative can enter the Vendor's bid(s) manually (i.e. Surrogate bidding).

1.4 Bidders participating in person by surrogate bidding must so indicate in their response to the initial Request for Quote-Formal (RFQF).

1.5 Failure to examine any drawings, specifications, and instruction will be at bidder's risk.

1.6 Price each item separately. Unit prices shall be shown. Bid prices must be net.

1.7 It is understood that reference to available specifications shall be sufficient to make the terms of such specifications binding on the bidder.

1.8 Bidders must furnish all information requested in the bid specifications. Further, when required each bidder must submit for bid evaluation cuts, sketches, descriptive literature and technical specifications covering the product offered. Reference to literature submitted with a previous bid or on file with the Mississippi Forestry Commission will not satisfy this provision.

1.9 Samples of items, when requested, must be furnished free of expense, and if not destroyed in testing will, upon request, be returned at the bidder's expense. Request for the return of samples must be made within ten (10) days following opening bids. Each individual sample must be labeled with bidder's name, manufacturer's brand name and number, State of Mississippi commodity number, bid number and item reference.

1.10 Time of performance. The number of calendar days in which delivery will be made after receipt of order shall be indicated in the bid specifications.

2. SUBMISSION OF BIDS

2.1 When submitting a bid electronically, the authorized signature may be typed or be an electronic signature.

2.2 Bids and modifications or corrections received after the closing time specified will not be considered.

2.3 When submitting the response to the RFQF in MAGIC, bidder must ensure all questions have been answered within the RFQF and all proposed items in bid have a response.

2.4 Bidders submitting paper responses should submit responses to the Mississippi Forestry Commission by the response deadline.

3. ACCEPTANCE OF BIDS

3.1 The Mississippi Forestry Commission reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any informality in bids and unless otherwise specified by the bidders, to accept any items on the bid. The Mississippi Forestry Commission reserves the right to modify or cancel in whole or in part any Invitation for Bids.

If a bidder fails to state the time within which a bid must be accepted, it is understood and agreed that the Mississippi Forestry Commission shall have 60 days to accept.

4. ERROR IN BID

4.1 IF a vendor is participating in a Live Auction, the vendor can notify the Mississippi Forestry Commission in the event of an erroneous bid via the chat message feature. Erroneous bids, where the mistake is apparent to the Mississippi Forestry Commission, may be deleted during the live auction.

5. AWARD

5.1 Contracts and purchases will be made or entered into with the lowest responsible bidder meeting specifications, except as otherwise specified in the bid specifications. Where more than one item is specified in the specifications, the Mississippi Forestry Commission reserves the right to determine the low bidder either on the basis of the individual item(s) or on the basis of all items included in its Invitation for Bids, or as expressly provided in the Mississippi Forestry Commission Invitation for Bids.

5.2 Unless the bidder specified otherwise in the bid, the Mississippi Forestry Commission may accept any item or group of items of any kind.

5.3 A written purchase order or contract award furnished to the successful bidder within the time of acceptance specified in the Invitation for Bid results in a binding contract without further action by either party. The contract shall consist solely of these General Conditions, the Instructions and Special Conditions, the successful bidder's bid, and the written purchase order or contract award. The contract shall not be assignable in whole or in part without the written consent of the Mississippi Forestry Commission.

6. INSPECTION

6.1 Final inspection and acceptance or rejection may be made at delivery destination, but all materials and workmanship shall be subject to inspection and test at all times and places, and when practicable. During manufacture, the right is reserved to reject articles which contain defective material and workmanship. Rejected material shall be removed by and at the expense of the contractor promptly after notification or rejection. Final inspection and acceptance or rejection of the materials or supplies shall be made as promptly as practicable, but failure to inspect and accept or reject materials or supplies shall not impose liability on the Mississippi Forestry Commission or any subdivision thereof for such materials or supplies as are not in accordance with the specification. In the event necessity requires the use of materials or supplies not conforming to the specification, payment therefore may be made at a proper reduction in price.

7. TAXES

7.1 The State is exempt from federal excise taxes and state and local sales or use taxes and bidders must quote prices which do not include such taxes. Exemption certificates will be furnished upon request.

8. BIDDERS

8.1 Bidding by state employees is prohibited. It is unlawful for any state official or employee to bid on, or sell, or offer for sale, any merchandise equipment or material, or similar commodity to the State of Mississippi during the tenure of his or her office or employment, or for the period prescribed by law thereafter, or to have any interest in the selling of the same to the State.

9. BID INFORMATION

9.1 Bid information and documents may be examined pursuant to the Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983, MS Code 25-61-1 et seq.

10. DEFINITIONS

10.1 The use of the word agency in any Bid Invitation solicitation or specification shall be intended to mean state agencies only.

11. PRECEDENCE

11.1 Bids shall be made and the contract shall be entered into in accordance with the General Conditions as hereinafter amended and modified. Should a conflict exist between the General Conditions and the Instructions and Special Conditions, the Instructions and Special Conditions shall take precedence.

12. WAIVER

12.1 The Mississippi Forestry Commission reserves the right to waive any General Condition, Special Condition, or minor specification deviation when considered to be in the best interest of the State.

13. CANCELLATION

13.1 Any contract or item award may be canceled with or without cause by the Mississippi Forestry Commission with the giving of 30 days written notice of intent to cancel. Cause for the Mississippi Forestry Commission to cancel may include, but is not limited to, delivery on time and/or no notice of delay in delivery time. Should the contract be canceled by the Mississippi Forestry Commission for failure to perform, the contractor will be disqualified from bidding for a period of twenty-four (24) months. The contractor may cancel a contract for cause with a thirty (30) day written notice of intent to cancel. In the event of cancellation of contract for any cause, whether failure to perform or cancellation by contractor, the Mississippi Forestry Commission will proceed to the next lowest vendor.

14. NONRESPONSIVE BIDS

14.1 Nonresponsive bids will not be considered. A non-responsive bid is considered to be a bid that does not comply with the minimum provisions of the specification. Any bidder found to repeatedly offer alternate products that are not compliant with specifications in an attempt to obtain a contract on the basis of pricing only will be disqualified from bidding for a period of 24 months.

15. SPECIFICATION CLARIFICATION

15.1 It shall be incumbent upon all bidders to understand the provisions of the specifications and to obtain clarification prior to the time and date set for the bid opening. Such clarification will be answered only in response to a written request.

16. PRE-QUALIFICATION PROCESS

16.1 The purpose of the RFQF is to advertise the competitive procurement for solicitation of formal quotes from potential bidders to participate in the Reverse Auction. The Mississippi Forestry Commission will be responsible for defining product categories, adding bidders, and publishing all bid related documents to the procurement portal. Once the responses have been received and the Opening Date has been reached, the Mississippi Forestry Commission will review the submissions to qualify bidders and determine a starting price for reverse auction items.

16.2 The Invitation for Bids/RFQF shall be advertised in accordance with Section 3.106.05.4 of the Mississippi Procurement Manual. The Mississippi Forestry Commission shall advertise for 14 consecutive days in accordance with Section 31-7-13(c) (i) (1) of the Miss. Code Ann. Responses to the RFQF will be due on the 8th working day after the last day of advertisement.

16.3 Responses to the RFQF will be reviewed by the Mississippi Forestry Commission for responsiveness to specifications. Price quotes received will be evaluated in conjunction with other market research to determine the starting price for the Auction.

16.4 The Mississippi Forestry Commission will accept bidder responses in MAGIC who have qualified meeting RFx specifications. Bidders not meeting specifications will not be allowed to participate in the Auction.

16.5 Once qualified, the Mississippi Forestry Commission will notify the vendor of Qualification and the date of the Live Auction via email. After receiving the confirmation email, bidders should review/ensure technical requirements for MAGIC have been met or confirm participation in person.

16.6 It is requested that bids be submitted on the basis of statewide distribution. Contractors must maintain adequate distribution capabilities and adequate stock of all items to insure prompt delivery.

17. STATEWIDE BIDDING

17.1 It is requested that bids be submitted on the basis of statewide distribution. Contractors must maintain adequate distribution capabilities and adequate stock of all items to insure prompt delivery.

18. FIRM BID AMOUNT

18.1 Prices accepted from bidder submissions shall be firm for the term of the contract except that the State shall receive the benefit of any price decrease in excess of five (5) percent. The contractor must provide written price reduction information within ten (10) days of its effective date.

19. CONTRACT EXTENSION

19.1 Automatic contract renewals or extensions are not allowed. Contracts must be extended or renewed with the proper documents signed or approved by the Mississippi Forestry Commission.

19.2 The Mississippi Forestry Commission reserves the right to extend the term of a contract, when necessary, to continue a source of supply whenever new or replacement contracts are not completed prior to the expiration date. Such extensions are dependent upon the agreement of the Contractor and shall not exceed three (3) months.

20. SUSPENSION AND DEBARMENT

20.1 By submitting a bid, the bidder is certifying that neither the bidder nor any potential subcontractors are debarred or suspended or are otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in federal assistance programs.

21. ASSIGNMENT

21.1 The Contractor shall not assign or subcontract in whole or in part, its right or obligations under this agreement without prior written consent of the Mississippi Forestry Commission.

22. INDEMINIFICATION

22.1 Contractor shall indemnify, defend, save and hold harmless, protect, and exonerate the State of Mississippi, its Commissioners, Board Members, officers, employees, agents, and representatives from and against all claims, demands, liabilities, suits, actions, damages, losses, and costs of every kind and nature whatsoever, including, without limitation, court costs, investigative fees and expenses, and attorneys' fees, arising out of or caused by Contractor's and/or its partners, principals, agents, employees, and/or subcontractors in the performance of or failure to perform this Agreement. In the State's sole discretion, Contractor may be allowed to control the defense of any such claim, suit, etc. In the event Contractor defends said claim, suit, etc., Contractor shall use legal counsel acceptable to the State; Contractor shall be solely liable for all reasonable costs and/or expenses associated with such defense and the State shall be entitled to participate in said defense. Contractor shall not settle any claim, suit, etc., without the State's concurrence, which the State shall not unreasonably withhold.

23. LIVE AUCTION

23.1 Notification of Auction Start date and time will be sent via email to qualifying bidders. If a bidder is unwilling or unable to participate through MAGIC, a representative from the Mississippi Forestry Commission can enter the Vendor's bid(s) manually (i.e. Surrogate Bidding). If a bidder elects to participate via Surrogate Bidding, the bidder must be physically present at the public bidding location, with the means to submit written bids for each offer made and signed by an authorized agent of the Vendor. A Bid Form will be provided to the Vendor

at the start of the auction. This form will not be returned to the bidder but will become a part of the Bid Documentation for Evaluation by the Mississippi Forestry Commission.

23.2 The Auction time may be extended at the discretion of the Mississippi Forestry Commission. Examples of reasons to extend an auction include, but are not limited to, technical difficulties experienced by the Mississippi Forestry Commission or bidder, the need to pause the Auction, or bids placed within the last few moments of bidding.

23.3 Communication with bidders participating electronically during the Auction may be done via the Live Chat Feature. The Mississippi Forestry Commission has the ability to send messages to particular bidders or broadcast to all bidders. Bidders can ONLY communicate with the Mississippi Forestry Commission, not other bidders.

23.4 Bidders may be removed from a Live Auction for improper conduct, including but not limited to profanity, threats, consistently entering erroneous or extremely low bids, or other disruptive behavior.

24. FORCE MAJEURE

24.1 If the Mississippi Forestry Commission is closed for any reason, including but not limited to: acts of God, strikes, lockouts, riots, acts of war, epidemics, governmental regulations superimposed after the fact, fire, earthquakes, floods, or other natural disasters (the "Force Majeure Events"), which closure prevents the opening of bids at the advertised date and time, all bids received shall be publicly opened and read aloud on the next business day that the agency shall be open and at the previously advertised time. The new date and time of the bid opening, as determined in accordance with this paragraph, shall not be advertised, and all bidders, upon submission of a bid proposal, shall be deemed to have knowledge of and shall have agreed to the provisions of this paragraph. Bids shall be received by the agency until the new date and time of the bid opening as set forth herein. The Mississippi Forestry Commission shall not be held responsible for the receipt of any bids for which the delivery was attempted and failed due to the closure of the Mississippi Forestry Commission as a result of a Force Majeure Event. Each bidder shall be required to ensure the delivery and receipt of its bid by the Mississippi Forestry Commission prior to the new date and time of the live auction or bid opening.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR 35-TON

TRAVELING TAIL EQUIPMENT TRAILER

DESCRIPTION:

- The trailer shall be a heavy-duty, single drop platform type designed for loading and hauling heavy equipment such as forklifts, construction, fire, and military equipment.
- The unit shall be designed with the use of computer-aided engineering and shall be fabricated with the most modern manufacturing equipment and techniques.
- The trailer shall be a new and a current production model.
- Prototypes and or demonstrators will not be acceptable.
- Each unit shall be furnished with standard equipment, options, and features.

CAPACITY:

- Minimum GVWR of 86,000 lbs. - 70,000 lbs. distributed and 50,000 lbs. concentrated load within 10 ft. at highway speeds (70 mph).
- The tare weight of trailer shall not exceed 18,500 pounds.

FRAME:

- The frame construction shall consist of four fabricated, hi-tensile strength steel beams.
- The flanges of the outer beams shall be 80,000 lbs. psi steel.
- The top and bottom flanges of the inner beams shall be 100,000 lbs. psi steel.
- The webbing of all beams shall be 80,000 lbs. psi steel.
- The cross members shall be 4" junior I-beams 50,000 lbs. psi throughout the lower deck, placed on 8" centers.
- The frame shall be of electrically welded per AWS-D1.1 structural steel.
- The outer beam shall have a 3/8" x 6" top flange, a 1/2" x 2-1/2" bottom flange and a 3/16" web.
- The inner beam shall have a 3/4" x 4" bottom flange in the undercarriage travel area and a 1/2" x 6" top flange and 3/16" web.
- The frame shall be designed, constructed, and rated for the full capacity of the trailer at highway speeds (70 mph).

PLATFORM:

- The platform shall be a single drop type, eight and one-half (8.5) feet in width and a minimum 51 feet in length, with a minimum of 41 feet of usable lower deck space.
- The drop from the upper deck to the lower platform shall be 90 degrees (+/- 5 degrees).
- The deck shall consist of a minimum 1-3/8" hardwood adequately secured in place by two screws per board on every other cross member.
- A flat type 18" x 102" rigid approach plate will be load bearing and be a structural part of the trailer without being hinged.
- Loaded deck height will not exceed 42 inches with 255/70R22.5 tires.

GOOSENECK:

- The kingpin plate shall not be less than 3/8" thick.
- The full-width gooseneck shall be suitable for use with a 48 inch fifth wheel height.
- The kingpin, SAE J-700b type, shall be located 18 inches from the front of the trailer.
- The fifth wheel shall have an 86-inch swing clearance.
- A winch cable roller shall be 24" in width and be centered and recessed at the rear of the top deck.

HYDRAULIC SYSTEM:

- The hydraulic system shall have 20 GPM at 2500 PSI with an open center valve.
- The control valve shall include an integrated flow control inlet that can handle up to 53 GPM with direct relief to the tank.
- The control valve must have direct acting solenoids for remote control operations on all functions with zinc-plated body, sealed controls and fully enclosed spools.
- Work sections of the valve will flow at 20 GPM, the power beyond will flow at 6 GPM.
- All cylinder circuits will include a counter balance valve and must operate at the full 20 GPM flow.

HYDRAULIC POWER SOURCE:

- Complete wet kit for tractor capable of supplying sufficient power to trailer shall be installed at point of delivery (not to exceed 150-mile radius from Pearl, MS).

WINCH:

- The winch shall be hydraulic, and mounted at the front of the upper deck.
- The winch will have a vertical lift capacity of 20,000 pounds and will be equipped with 85 feet of 1/2" independent wire rope core (IWRC) 6 x 37 flexible cable, and should be complete with cable roller guide.
- The winch shall be of two speed design.
- The winch shall have a 3-foot long high-test 5/8" lead chain and 1/2" hook shall be attached to the cable by a swedge lock with thimble.

- Winch to be equipped with a spring loaded level wind plate to ensure correct cable windup.
- Roller shall be mounted at the rear of the upper deck, to prevent cable wear.
- Winch shall be operated by trailer mounted control lever, and wireless remote.

TOOL BOXES:

- Shall have twin mounted upper deck, street and curbside, accessible while trailer is fully loaded, and be a minimum of 7"H x 34"W x 29"D with locking T-latches to be located in the front side of the upper deck. (Access opening shall be a minimum of 5-3/4" x 16").
- Shall have twin mounted beneath lower deck, street and curbside, be accessible while trailer is fully loaded, and be a minimum of 42" W x 28" D x 9" H with locking T-latches.

TIE DOWNS:

- The full perimeter of the deck (upper and lower) shall be provided with a combination keyhole chain slots with square stake pocket cutouts located on 16" centers.
- The stake pocket cutouts shall measure 1-5/8" x 2-7/8", and are suitable for use with removable (lift-out) sections of stake-type sides.
- In addition, six keyhole chain slots shall be evenly spaced across the rear approach plate.
- The center of the deck shall be equipped with keyhole chain slots located on 16" centers.
- In deck chain pockets shall be evenly spaced on the lower deck, four street and four curbside.
- Flush mounted, angled D-rings shall be provided on both street and curbside, upper and lower deck on 48" centers.
- D-rings shall also be provided on the front outer corners of the upper deck, and on each side of the winch.
- The trailer shall also be provided with a web mounted rub rail, both street and curbside, along the full length of the lower deck.

ACCESS STEPS:

- Shall have pull out steps, street and curbside, to provide safe footing for access to top of lower deck.

WHEELS:

- All wheels shall be 22.5 inch polished aluminum, 10 bolt pattern.

TIRES:

- Shall be 255/70R22.5 radial.

BRAKES:

- The trailer shall be equipped with an ABS brake anti-lock system.

- The trailer shall also have full air-operated brake equipment for all wheels, outboard drums, automatic slack adjuster, with heavy-duty, 12-1/4" x 7-1/2", non-asbestos lining material.
- Both axles will be equipped with automatic spring brake application upon accidental breakaway, complying with all State and Federal ICC requirements.

SUSPENSION:

- The suspension shall be of the thru-axle type with air ride suspension.
- The trailer will be a tandem axle trailer, with each axle having a 25,000 LB capacity with a with manual dump valve.
- Axles will be equipped with dual wheels and oil seal hubs.
- Approximate axle spacing - 49 inches.

UPPER DECK RAMP:

- Shall be a minimum of 6 feet in length, fully covered in traction plate material to accommodate wet loading conditions, and air operated with a minimum capacity of 10,000lb.
- Load angle shall not be more than 12.0 degrees.
- Shall be 102" wide.

TAIL:

- Tail section shall be a minimum of 15 feet.
- Tail shall be operable with a trailer mounted hydraulic lever and wireless remote.
- The tail shall be capable of lifting 24,000 pounds with the movement of the hydraulic traveling undercarriage and lift arm.
- The tail load angle shall not be more than 12.0 degrees.
- The tail shall be solid full length, non-folding, connected to the main deck with a single hinge.
- The hinge pin shall be a minimum of 2 1/4 inches in diameter.
- Tail section shall be covered with traction plate material to accommodate wet loading conditions.

UNDERCARRIAGE:

- The undercarriage shall travel forward and return hydraulically.
- There shall be no traveling hydraulic lines for sliding axle operation.
- The undercarriage shall be painted black with polyester powder coating.
- It shall travel on 4" diameter 60,000 lb. greaseable rollers and pads.
- All rollers and pads shall be removable and replaceable.
- The undercarriage shall lock mechanically to the tail deck creating a secure positive lock and alignment while the trailer is in travel mode.
- Undercarriage wiring, air and hydraulic lines will be routed through a heavy plastic flex chain for support and maximum protection.
- A centralized grease system will be standard equipment.
- The centralized grease system will have grease zerk ports to service the axles.

LIGHTS:

- The trailer shall be equipped with clear lens L.E.D. lights with chrome bezel and conspicuity tape in compliance with applicable State and Federal Motor Vehicle Laws, including turn signals, dual tail lights, midship turn signals, and brake lights.
- A standard 7-way receptacle, SAE J-560a type, shall be provided.
- All wiring shall be of adequate capacity and be properly installed for maximum protection from damage and weather.
- Wiring harness shall be mounted in rubber grommets whenever the harness is inserted through metal structure.
- All lights shall be recessed or otherwise provided with adequate guards to prevent accidental damage.
- The wiring harness shall have a 7-year warranty.
- Wiring harness is to be neoprene-compression sealed and will be clamped approximately every two feet of run.
- Lighting will be quick disconnect and shock mounted.
- A light shall be mounted to illuminate the license plate on the rear bumper of the trailer.

FINISH:

- Trailer is to have all mill scale and weld slag removed.
- The raw trailer frame is to be baked in a 400-degree oven for 60 minutes to purge the oils and contaminants from its surface.
- The entire frame shall be steel shot-blasted to bright white metal.
- A zinc-rich powder primer is to be applied prior to painting the entire frame with polyester powder coat color paint.
- The powder paint is to be cured in a bake oven at 400 degrees.
- Color of the trailer is to be black.

CONTROLS:

- The trailer shall be equipped with a centralized hydraulic control center.
- Tail section and winch shall be operable by wireless remote.
- Detailed operating instructions shall be etched onto a lighted aluminum panel.

EQUIPMENT:

- The unit shall be complete with all standard equipment and accessories that are normally furnished by manufacturer.
- In addition, equipment shall be furnished as follows:
 1. Unit to meet all applicable OSHA requirements.
 2. Unit to meet all applicable FMVSS, DOT, and ICC requirements.
 3. Mud flap brackets and flaps.
 4. Two speed landing gear.
 5. Dual glad-hand connection air supply at the front of the trailer.

6. The rear bumper to meet all applicable FMVSS 571.223 and 571.224 standards
7. Deck Length minimum 51' Overall, with a minimum 41' Lower Deck

DATA PLATE:

- Each unit shall be provided a data plate that is permanently attached by plate and weld bead for easy identification.
- The data plate shall include the at minimum, the following information:
 1. Manufacturer
 2. Model Number
 3. Date of Manufacture
 4. Manufacturer's serial number, unique to each unit. The trailer serial number shall contain 17 characters and shall conform to Federal vehicle identification numbering standards.
 5. Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR)
 6. Gross Axle Weight Rating (GAWR) Front
 7. Gross Axle Weight Rating (GAWR) Rear
 8. Tire Size
 9. Rim Size
 10. Cold Tire Inflation Pressure
