Explanation of the need to be fulfilled by this item(s) and why it is the only one that can meet the specific needs of the department:

Many people with risks for heart disease and stroke—such as high blood pressure and high cholesterol—do not know that they have these conditions or how to effectively control them to prevent a heart attack or stroke. High blood pressure (hypertension) is one of the most important risk factors for heart disease, stroke, kidney failure, and diabetes complications. Nearly 2 out of 3 adults with high cholesterol and about half of adults with high blood pressure don't have their condition yet under control, according to the CDC. High blood pressure and high blood cholesterol usually have no signs or symptoms. Thus, many people don't know that their blood pressure or cholesterol levels are too high. The purpose of requesting the brochures are help health educators and healthcare providers to articulate what role the patient can take in keeping their blood pressure in control including diet, exercise, stress management, and medication adherence.

Furthermore, in 2011 the Office of Communications developed an automated publication ordering form on the Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention Program's Publication webpage, which prompts the program's staff to ship brochures to the requestor. The HDSPP has consistently measured how many Mississippians are empowered with knowledge to prevent heart disease and stroke and the associated risk factors based upon the number of requests for Journeyworks Publishing educational brochures.

When comparing similar commodities, it was determined that the selected educational materials from Journeyworks Publishing effectively addressed the Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention Program's (HDSPP) target audience. The materials are researched and written by professional health education writers and editors. Journeyworks Publishing's professional reviewers help ensure the accuracy of the material as well as the appropriateness of presentation. When giving health-related advice, citing statistics, or suggesting specific courses of action, they rely on well-respected resources, such as published materials from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the National Institutes of Health (NIH). All of Journeyworks Publishing materials are designed for clarity and ease of reading. The notice shall contain a detailed explanation of why the commodity is not a sole source procurement. Appropriate documentation shall also be submitted if applicable. The enclosed form (OSS) may be used if you so desire.

If after a review of the submitted notice and documents, Mississippi State Department of Health determines that the commodity in the proposed sole source request can be provided by another person or entity, then Mississippi State Department of Health will withdraw the sole source request publication

from the procurement portal website and submit the procurement of the commodity to an advertised competitive bid or selection process.

If Mississippi State Department of Health determines after review that there is only one (1) source for the required commodity, the Mississippi State Department of Health will appeal to the Public Procurement Review Board. Mississippi State Department of Health will have the burden of proving that the commodity is only provided by one (1) source.
