ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

Sealed bids for the construction of the **Pascagoula Beach Park & Pier Access Improvements** project will be received by the City of Pascagoula, at the Pascagoula City Hall, 603 Watts Avenue, Pascagoula, MS 39567 until 2:00 p.m., Local Time, March 28, 2017, at which time the Bids received will be publicly opened and read.

The project consists of improvements to the existing pedestrian access located at the south side of Beach Park and improvements to the Beach Park Pier access ramps. The Beach Park access includes demolition of the existing sidewalk and stairs to construct an improved ADA ramp and concrete stair entry. Included in this work will be concrete retaining walls, concrete sidewalk and minor fencing. The Beach Pier access improvements include demolition of the existing concrete ramps, minor pier demolition and construction of approximately 3,200 square feet of composite decking, new pier ramps, and associated timber framing. Also included will be site lighting improvements and landscaping.

Bids will be received from a single prime Contractor. Bids shall be on a unit price basis, with additive alternate bid items, if applicable, as indicated on the Bid Form.

All bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope addressed to the City Clerk of Pascagoula. If a bid is submitted by mail, the post office address of the City Clerk is P.O. Drawer 908, Pascagoula, Mississippi 39568-0908.

All bid envelopes should contain the bidder's name and mailing address on the face of the envelope and shall specify the name of the bid package.

Contract Documents may be examined at the Issuing Office, Monday through Thursday (between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.) and Friday (between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and noon). Copies of the Contract Documents may be obtained as described below:

Contract documents are being made available via paper copy or pdf for a charge of \$100.00 (hard copy) or \$50.00 (CD). Plan holders are required to log-in or register for an account at www.bmaprojects.com to view and order Contract Documents. All plan

holders are required to have a valid email address for registration. The cost for the Contract Documents is non-refundable and must be purchased through the website. For questions regarding website registration and online orders, please contact Plan House Printing at (228) 248-0181.

The date that the Contract Documents are transmitted by the Issuing Office will be considered prospective Bidder's date of receipt of the Contract Documents. Partial sets of Contract Documents will not be available from the Issuing Office. Neither Owner nor Engineer will be responsible for full or partial sets of Contract Documents, including Addenda, if any, obtained from sources other than the Issuing Office.

Each bid shall be accompanied by a Certified Check on a solvent bank or a Bidder's Bond issued by a Surety Company licensed to operate in the State of Mississippi, in the amount of five percent (5%) of the total bid price, payable to the City of Pascagoula, as bid security. Bidders shall also submit a current financial statement, if requested by the City of Pascagoula. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a Performance Bond and a Payment Bond each in the amount of 100 hundred percent (100%) of the Contract amount.

For bids exceeding \$50,000.00, Bidder must indicate his <u>Certificate of Responsibility Number</u> on the outside of sealed proposal as required by Mississippi Law. Effective July 1, 2010; per MS Code 31-3-21(3); any bid submitted by a nonresident contractor which does not include the nonresident contractor's current state law pertaining to such state's treatment of nonresident contractors, shall be rejected and not considered for award. If no such law exists in the nonresident contractor's state, then the non-resident contract may provide a statement to that effect.

This project is being funded in whole or in part by the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG). All federal CDBG requirements will apply to the contract. Bidders on this work will be required to comply with the President's Executive Order No. 11246 & Order No. 11375 which prohibits discrimination in employment regarding race, creed, color, sex, or national origin. Bidders must comply with Title VI if the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Davis Bacon Act, the Anti-Kickback Act, the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, and 40 CFR 33.240. Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, requires that training, employment and other economic opportunities generated by certain types of construction projects shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed to low and moderate income persons and to the businesses that provide economic opportunities to low- and very-low income persons. Contractors must be registered and in good standing with the U.S. Federal Contractor Registration System for Award Management.

Bidders must also make positive efforts to use small and minority-owned business and to offer employment, training and contracting opportunities in accordance with Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968. Attention of bidders is particularly called to the requirements as to conditions of employment to be observed and minimum wage rates to be paid under the contract.
