Each Bidder must deposit with his bid, security in the amount, for and subject to the conditions provided in the Notice and Instructions to Bidders.

Bidders must comply with Section 3, of the HUD ACT of 1968, the Davis Bacon Act, the Anti-Kickback Act, the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, and the Presidents Executive Order No. 11246.

All Bids submitted in excess of \$50,000 by a prime or subcontractor to do erection, building, construction, repair, maintenance, or related work, must comply with Section 31-3-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, must secure from the State Contractor's Board a "Certificate of Responsibility" license, where applicable, the foregoing certificate number and license number must be indicated on the exterior of the sealed bid envelope before it can be opened.

Certification of Non-segregated Facilities: The Contractor must complete the Certification of Non-segregated Facilities included in the specifications.

Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968 requires that the City and Contractors participating in CDBG projects give opportunities for job training and employment to lower income residents of the Section 3 area that is described as the city limits of the City of Marks. Section 3 also requires that "to the maximum extent feasible" contracts for work in connection with Section 3 covered projects be awarded to business concerns that are located in or owned in substantial part by persons residing in the Section 3 area.
