The *Holmes County Board of Supervisors*, Lexington, Mississippi, do hereby request proposals for "Architect/Engineering" in relation to its proposed public facilities Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Economic Development project. The project activities will include: *Repair renovation/retrofit to the existing manufacturing building facility formerly known as the G & C Building located at 165 Grief Lane, Durant, MS.*

The Scope of work will consist of: preparation of preliminary cost estimates, preparation of plans/specifications, advertisement for bids, recommendation of contract award and preparation of the contract(s) in accordance with CDBG guidelines; conduct pre-construction conference in accordance with project administration; inspect construction in progress; and advising the *Board* and the *Project Administrator* on payments and other related architect/engineering services requirements in accordance with CDBG and other program funding source guidelines.

Those desiring consideration should submit proposals by the time and date stated and must include the following:

1. Qualifications - List of qualifications of each staff person to be assigned to project.
2. Experience - Information regarding the experience of the firm. This information should include types of project activities undertaken.
3. Capacity for Performance - Identify the number and title of staff available to be assigned to provide services and capacity to perform the work within the time limitations.
4. Familiarity - Knowledge of the type of problems applicable to the project.

All proposals will be rated on the following system to determine the best proposal: Description and Maximum Points: Qualifications - 30; Experience - 30; Capacity - 30; Familiarity - 30; Total: 120 Points.


Proposals will be reviewed by the *Board* using the above selection criteria. Each member of the board will assign points to each criterion based on the content of the proposal. Negotiations will be conducted to determine a mutually satisfactory contract first with the firm receiving the highest accumulated points, as rated by the board.

Final award will be made to the responsible proposer whose proposal is determined to be the most advantageous to the county. *Proposals should be in a sealed envelope marked Architect/Engineer Proposal - Holmes County Board of Supervisors (G & C Building Project).*

## Colts sweep three in Memphis


